HIE will give a provider a longitudinal view of their patients' medical information across disparate health care settings. This "community view" of a patient's information will enable effective care coordination and can increase the quality of care and reduce costs.

Eventually, the HIE will also accommodate image-sharing and provide connectivity to government health systems (such as the Social Security Administration) and public health.
